Program Description:

Lakehead University offers a Master of Arts degree in Clinical Psychology. The master degree normally requires two years of full-time study. Admission Requirement:

- MA applicants must hold an Honours Bachelor of Arts or Science degree from an approved college or university in Psychology with at least a 70% average (B) based on their last 20 half courses or equivalent.
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores for Verbal, Quantitative, and Analytical tests are required before an application can be considered for MA or MSc program. Subject GRE scores (Psychology) are also required in order to be considered for the MA program.
